

City of Cambridge April 24. 1849

An Ordinance providing for the Election and prescribing the duties of the Prudential School Committee

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Cambridge, as follows: 1<sup>st</sup> There shall be chosen at the commencement of each Municipal Year, by a joint vote of the City Council six persons, two from each Ward, to be styled the Prudential School Committee

2<sup>d</sup>. The Prudential School Committee shall have the care of the School Houses of the City; they shall cause the same to be repaired from time to time, and kept in good order — provide fuel for the Schools and all things necessary for the Comfort of the Scholars therein.

3<sup>d</sup>. The third Section of An Ordinance relating to the Powers and duties of the School Committee, passed on the ninth day of June, Eighteen Hundred and forty six, be, and the same is hereby repealed.
