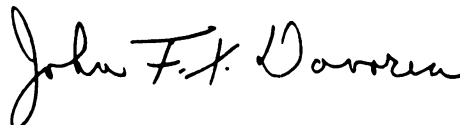

2. The purposes for which the corporation is formed are as follows:

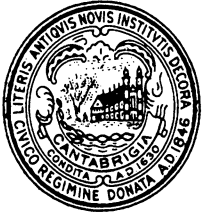
To promote, encourage and foster the performance of practical and applied scientific research for the benefit of mankind in, but not limited to, materials applications, environmental protection, and energy conservation;

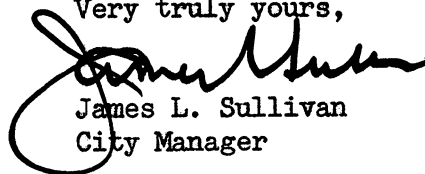
