Gerald Frazier, in sales, formerly of Cambridge, 64

Gerald R. Frazier of Ventura, Calif., formerly of Cambridge, a sales executive, died of a heart attack Tuesday afternoon at San Francisco International Airport. He was 64.

Mr. Frazier was born in Cambridge, where he spent most of his life. He was educated at Cambridge Rindge and Technical School and Connecticut Wesleyan College.

He has lived in California for the past seven years.

Mr. Frazier was national sales manager for Borden Chemical Company until his retirement in 1984. Previously, he had been director of sales for Alcoa.

In 1941, Mr. Frazier was drafted as a pitcher by the Detroit Tigers, but enlisted in the U.S. Navy during World War II. He served as a fighter pilot, and received the Distinguished Flying Cross and several other medals when he piloted the first plane to strike the Japanese ship Yamato in 1943. That same year, he was shot down.

Mr. Frazier was also one of the original Blue Angels after the war.

He was a member of the Disabled American Veterans.

Mr. Frazier leaves his wife, Marian (Looney); five sons, Michael, Kevin, Gerald, Daniel and John; three daughters, Maureen Frazier, Eileen Frazier and Kathleen Blakeman; three sisters, Frances Curran, Elizabeth Hurley and Helen MacLachlan; and seven grandchildren.

A funeral Mass will be said for Mr. Frazier at 10 a.m. today in Our Lady of Pity Church, 35 Middlesex St., Cambridge.

Burial will be in Cambridge Cemetery.
