WHEREAS: Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. was the son and grandson of Baptist preachers, and found great solace and strength in the power and beauty of gospel music; and

WHEREAS: On this day, we are honored to attend this most fitting testimony to the spirituality and transcendence of gospel music, as the Cambridge Multicultural Arts Center presents its 8th annual gospel concert, called "A Joyful Noise"; and

WHEREAS: This concert celebrates the life and work of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. by celebrating the music which he so loved; and

WHEREAS: The Cambridge Multicultural Arts Center has assembled the finest gospel musicians to be found in our City and in the Greater Boston area, for a performance which is sure to move the souls of all fortunate enough to share in this event; and

WHEREAS: "A Joyful Noise" will showcase the range and diversity of gospel musical genres, and performances will include spirituals by vocalists Ruth Hamilton, Beverly Mosby and Emery Stephens, a fusion of gospel and blues by Larry Watson and saxophonist Alphonso Thomas, a fusion of gospel and jazz by Gordon Michaels and the GNE Repertory Ensemble, traditional gospel by St. Paul AME Church's New Temple Singers and their charismatic children's choir, Angels Without Wings, contemporary gospel by Frances Ingram; and work songs by Unified Voices of Christ; and

WHEREAS: The 8th Annual "A Joyful Noise" Concert would not have been possible without the generosity of the Massachusetts Cultural Council, the LIFE Foundation Harvard University Office of Community Affairs, and most certainly the production talents of our master and mistress of ceremonies for this special evening, Mr. Donnell Patterson and Ms. Patricia Dance; and

WHEREAS: "A Joyful Noise" will emanate from Sanders Theater on this day, Saturday, January 14, 1995, which will warm and inspire our hearts and minds; now therefore be it
