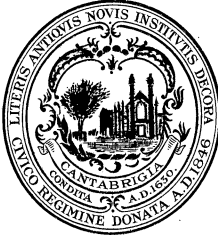

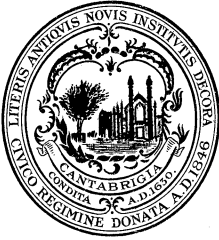

There are no catch basins on this side of the street; and particularly in front of 10, 12 + 14 Carlisle St. the rain water lies on an average of five to six weeks before disappearing. This creates a very unhealthy condition.

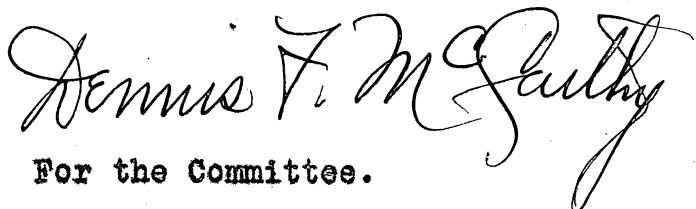
