- WHEREAS: Recent reports have charged that permits have been granted for parking facilities by the City without legal authority because they may do not conform with EPA laws and regulations; and
- WHEREAS: The Binney Street garage, currently under construction, has been the subject of great concern, including at a Licensing Commission hearing in July, where the opponents cited their questions about its conformity to environmental laws; and
- WHEREAS: The legality of the construction of the Binney Street garage and possibly other structures presently under construction is, therefore, raised; and
- WHEREAS: There is the specter of City liability if such parking facilities are built illegally; now therefore be it
- ORDERED: That the City Manager is requested to request the Building Commissioner, with the assistance of the City Solicitor, to review the Binney Street Garage building permit and that of any other parking facilities presently under construction with a view to revoking them until such a time as the legal status of these facilities is determined, assuming that that is the legal determination of the City Solicitor; and be it further
- ORDERED: That the City Manager request that the Building Commissioner review very carefully any new requests for permits for parking facilities in light of these legal uncertainties.
