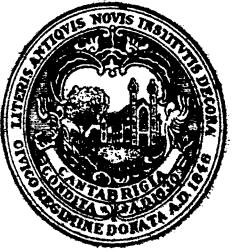

IN CITY COUNCIL

May 3, 1938.

ORDERED:-

That His Honor, the Mayor, be and hereby is authorized to execute a lease, in accordance with form approved by the City Solicitor, between the City of Cambridge and Herbert E. Johnson 103 Normandy Avenue Cambridge, the same providing for the occupancy by him of a portion of the land at the southeasterly corner of lot (formerly the corner of Bennett and Eliot Streets) containing approximately nine hundred (900) square feet, on which formerly stood the Brattle Square Building, known as Lot No. 14, Assessors Block Plan 165, at an annual rental of one hundred (\$100.00), for a period of one year.

The building now located on the above mentioned lot is to be used for restaurant purposes.

The right is reserved by the City of Cambridge to revoke said lease after giving thirty days notice to the lessee.

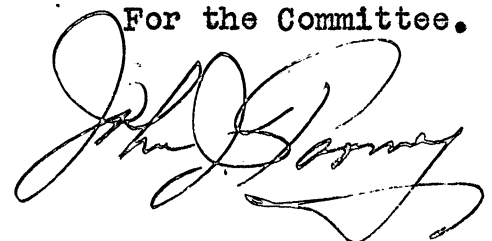
