WHEREAS: Once again the Cambridge Police Honor Guard has been invited by the Right Honorable, The Lord Mayor of Dublin, Gay Mitchell, to participate in the Saint Patrick's Day Parade in Dublin this coming March 17, 1994; and

WHEREAS: This event is an occasion which brings the citizens and visitors to the Emerald Isle together in the heart of the capital city to fully participate in all the cultural activities surrounding this holiday; and

WHEREAS: The people of Cambridge should take pride in the motivation, discipline and personal commitment which has been consistently demonstrated by all the members of the Honor Guard; a diverse group of police officers who have been singled out for recognition by Police Commissioner Perry Anderson and both branches of the Massachusetts Legislature; and

WHEREAS: The Honor Guard, under the direction of Sergeant David K. Betz, Sr. has been conducting a series of fundraising events to pay for the cost of traveling to Ireland to participate in the St. Patrick's Day Parade and to represent the City of Cambridge, not only in the parade, but in a much larger role as "emissaries" of the Cambridge City Council in our ongoing negotiations to establish a sister city relationship; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record officially acknowledging the Cambridge Police Honor Guard, not only for being invited to participate in the St. Patrick's Day Parade in Dublin, Ireland, but for their many previous accomplishments on behalf of the good people of Cambridge; and be it further

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RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to prepare a suitable resolution on behalf of the entire City Council and to forward same to Sergeant Betz, with the fervent hope that the Honor Guard enjoy a safe and successful trip to and from Ireland.
