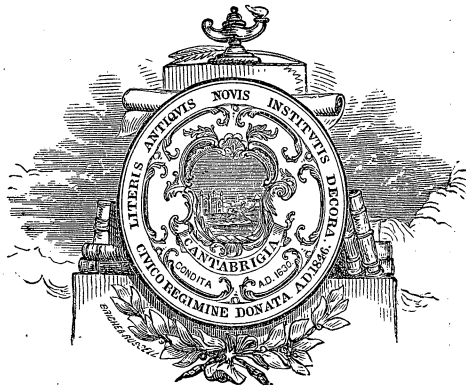


CITY OF CAMBRIDGE.



In Board of Mayor and Aldermen, Aug. 30. 1865

WHEREAS, in the opinion of the Board, the safety and convenience of the inhabitants require that *Berkley Street, so called, between Phillips Place and Craigie Street* should be *laid out as a public highway,*

it is therefore hereby Ordered, that due notice be given to *the owners in said Berkley Street, and all other persons interested,*

that this Board intends to *lay out* the Street before mentioned, by taking a portion of *their* land and laying out the same as a public street — and that *Wednesday, the 13th* day of *September next,* at *7* o'clock, P. M., is assigned as the time for hearing any objections which may be made thereto.
