
Dear Sir:

This is to inform you that on Wednesday, March 10, 1982 while walking to Harvard Square on my way to work about 6.45 A.M. that I slipped on an unnatural accumulation of snow and ice that was on the sidewalk in front of a 4 story concrete garage across the street from the Broadway Supermarket; the Broadway Supermarket is located at 468 Broadway, Cambridge, Mass. 02139 - the exact address of this 4 story garage is not known to me, but the garage building is owned by Harvard University. Because I did not want to be late for work, I picked myself up and continued on to my workplace. I had slid on an unnatural accumulation of snow and ice and had crashed my right shoulder into a parking meter. I work for the Veterans Administration Outpatient Clinic Day Treatment Center, 125 Lincoln Street, Boston, Mass. 02111. Later in the day when the pain became severe I went to our main Clinic, the Veterans Administration Outpatient Clinic, 17 Court Street, Boston, Mass. 02108 and sought treatment from the Personnel Physician, Dr. William Rogers. He, in turn, referred me to Dr. Timothy Dennehy who is also on the staff of this Clinic. My right shoulder and collarbone were X-rayed and damage was discovered. I was given shortwave diathermy; told to take analgesics and to try to rest the area of the shoulder and the collarbone and was treated at the Rehabilitation Medicine Department of the Veterans Administration Outpatient Clinic for these injuries.

Currently I am still in pain but the Veterans Administration will only give a certain amount of limited medical treatment to me as an employee for an injury that is not service connected. My reason for the late notice of this accident is that I was unaware of whether the City of Cambridge, Massachusetts or Harvard University had jurisdiction over the area where the accident did occur - hence, I am notifying both the City of Cambridge and Harvard University of what transpired and what I did.
