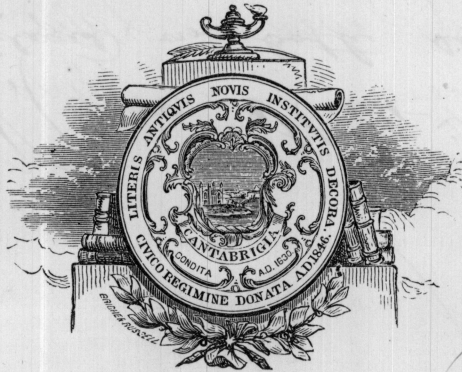


CITY OF CAMBRIDGE.



In Board of Aldermen,

June 26 1872

Resolved, That the public convenience and necessity require that

Moore Street
be widened on both sides thereof

by taking for this purpose certain parcels of land, as shown on a plan prepared by the City Engineer, and now before this Board.

Therefore, Ordered, that so much of the land on *both sides of*

Moore Street

as is included between the *red* lines shown on a plan of

plan for Washington St. District Improvement,
~~Street~~, drawn by the City Engineer, dated

June 1870

and now before this

Board, be taken for public use, and laid out as a public way and a part of said

Moore
Street.

Ordered, That damages occasioned by said widening be estimated and awarded as follows:

Ordered, That *until Oct. 1, 1872*, be allowed to the persons whose land is taken for said *widening*, for the removal of *buildings & fences* standing on the land so taken as aforesaid.
