WHEREAS:-

A communication has been received from Walter Hudson, Building Wrecker, 38 Amory Street, Cambridge, offering to raze the Felton School at the corner of Amory and Summer Streets, Cambridge and pay to the City the sum of fifty dollars (\$50.00), all material in said building to become the property of the building wrecker, it is therefore

ORDERED:-

That the Superintendent of Public Buildings be and hereby is authorized to grant a license to Walter Hudson to raze the Felton School,

PROVIDED, that before starting to raze the school the aforesaid Walter Hudson shall pay into the City Treasury the sum of fifty dollars (\$50.00), and

PROVIDED FURTHER, that the building be demolished and the material taken away within thirty days.
