Dr. James McGuire, Mt. Auburn physician

Dr. James L. McGuire of Westboro, chairman of medicine at Mt. Auburn Hospital in Cambridge and professor of medicine at Harvard University, died Saturday at Maine Medical Center in Portland after suffering a heart attack in North Conway, N.H. He was 48.

Born and raised in Dedham, Dr. McGuire graduated from the University of Massachusetts at Amherst in 1970 and was a member of the university's first medical school class. He received his medical degree in 1974.

After completing a residency and rheumatology fellowship at Dartmouth-Hitchcock Medical Center in Hanover, N.H., he completed a fellowship in mineral metabolism at the University of Texas Health Sciences Center in Dallas, Texas.

Dr. McGuire practiced rheumatology at Worcester City Hospital for 10 years and worked as an associate professor of medicine and cell biology at the University of Massachusetts Medical Center. He served on the Public Health Council for the commonwealth of Massachusetts from 1984 to 1988.

He also worked at Stanford University, where he served as chief of staff at Stanford Health Services. He held several positions at Stanford Medical School including professor of medicine, associate dean of graduate medical education and associate dean for clinical affairs. He also coached the Stanford men's lacrosse team. He returned to the Boston area in 1995.

Dr. McGuire was the co-

author of the book "Living with Rheumatoid Arthritis." He was an avid supporter of men's lacrosse at Stanford University and UMass at Amherst. He loved sports and enjoyed fishing and golf. He had recently cleared several miles of a cross-country ski trail in the woods behind his home.

Dr. McGuire is survived by his wife, Linda (Rupnow); two children, Mary and John, both of Westboro; his parents, Lofts "Mickey" and Helen McGuire of Dedham; three brothers, Jeffrey R. of East Harwich, John B. of Westwood and Jay D. of Dedham; and several nieces and nephews.

A funeral Mass will be celebrated at 11 a.m. today at St. Mary's Church in Dedham.

A memorial service will be held at Stanford University at a later date.

Burial will be Brookdale Cemetery, Dedham.

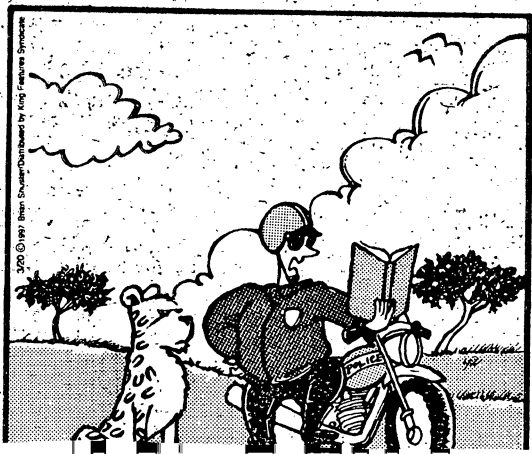

ORDER ADOPTED
