WHEREAS: The President of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, Charles M. Vest, has proclaimed Monday, June 12, 1995 as Cambridge First Day at MIT through the action of the attached resolution; and

WHEREAS: This day has been marked by many special events including a Small Cambridge Business Partners Reception which was held this morning in recognition of the over 400 small Cambridge businesses on the attached list that have worked with MIT in fiscal year '94-'95; and

WHEREAS: The small Cambridge businesses working with MIT include neighborhood stores such as Pill's True Value Hardware in Central Square, local branches of larger chains such as Midas Muffler on Massachusetts Avenue, new establishments such as Carberry's Bakery and Coffeehouse on Prospect Street and long time community members such as Slate Stationers on Church Street; and

WHEREAS: MIT announced today that its 1995 economic contribution to the City of Cambridge is \$59 million and has detailed the sources of its contribution in the attached \$59 million bill; and

WHEREAS: Forty two million of the total MIT economic contribution represents MIT purchases from Cambridge businesses - \$15 million of which was spent on small businesses; and

WHEREAS: MIT has established this day not only to celebrate the partnerships between the Institute and small Cambridge businesses, but also those between the many city officials, individuals, businesses and community organizations of the Cambridge community who work alongside the faculty, students and staff of MIT to enhance the overall quality of life in our city; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this City Council does hereby join the Massachusetts Institute of Technology in its celebration of Cambridge First Day and the many successful partnerships that have been formed in support of positive educational, community and economic initiatives in Cambridge; and be it further

RESOLVED: That this City Council does hereby salute the small businesses of Cambridge and recognize their significant contributions to the economic health of our city.
