- WHEREAS:** Complaints have been received from Richdale Avenue residents regarding traffic congestion as well as noise and air pollution resulting from some business practices allegedly carried out by Magirus/Iveco Truck Service located on Richdale Avenue. As to traffic congestion, it is reported that at least on one or two days each week, its trucks are parked in all the reserved residential parking spaces. As to pollution, it is noted that oftentimes after repairs, etc. have been made to a truck, the truck is parked on Richdale Avenue for an hour or more with the diesel engine running, creating both noise for the neighbors and emitting exhaust pollutants into the air; now therefore be it
- ORDERED:** That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to request the Director of Traffic & Parking to intensify surveillance and patrol of the area in question and request the Chair of the License Commission to examine the situation and assure that the trucking entity's referenced on-street practices are in compliance with all relevant city ordinances; and be it further
- ORDERED:** That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to report back to the Council on this matter within two weeks.
