To the Honorable, the City Council:

I am hereby requesting the appropriation of a grant from the Massachusetts Department of Public Health, Bureau of Substance Abuse Services for \$100,000 to the Grant Fund FY04 Human Services Salaries and Wages account (\$57,220), Other Ordinary Maintenance account (\$39,450), and Travel and Training account (\$3,330) to provide funds to enable the Cambridge Prevention Coalition to implement its Cambridge Community Mobilizing for Change Around Alcohol Project. This project will build upon the Coalition's past work in the Server Intervention Project where servers and sellers of alcohol have been trained in responsible alcohol service and the avoidance of sales to underage youth. The grant will support a portion of the salaries of two community health trainers.

In addition, the Coalition will be collaborating with Mothers Against Drunk Driving and several community-based organizations in mobilizing youth and their families in a social marketing campaign to help influence community norms about the acceptability of purchasing alcohol for underage youth.
