

City of Cambridge.

In Board of Aldermen, April 21st 1869.

The Committee on Roads & Bridges to whom was referred that portion of the petition of Willard Phillips & et al, asking for certain repairs on Simnaean Street, Ward 5, would report that they have attended to the duty assigned them.

They find that this street is one of the oldest in the city, but from a misconception of the facts as to its acceptance by the City, it has not received that care and attention which it otherwise would have received. The Committee are of the unanimous opinion that the repairs asked for should be immediately made, but they also find that a great part of the inconvenience arises from the want of proper drainage, and that it will be extremely difficult to keep the street in proper repair, until a drain is built through said street. As the Committee on Reservoirs & Drains have reported that the only objection to the construction of a common sewer through this

street, is the want of sufficient funds for the purpose, your Committee would recommend that ~~the sum of Six Thousand Dollars (\$6000) be taken from the appropriation for Reserved Fund and added to the appropriation for Reservoirs and Drains, and that~~ the report of the Committee on Reservoirs & Drains on this petition be recommitted for further consideration.
