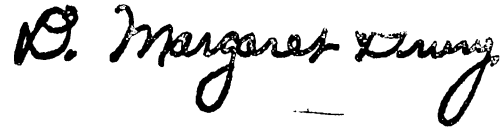

WHEREAS: It has come to the attention of the City Council that the National Building Museum in Washington D.C. is honoring Homeowners Rehab Inc.'s (HRI) affordable housing development, Auburn Court, in a new exhibit called "Affordable Housing: Designing an American Asset; and

WHEREAS: The exhibit spotlights Auburn Court and seventeen other affordable housing projects from around the country that display design excellence; and

WHEREAS: The seventeen projects were selected by the museum's chief curator and two other experts from among 180 nominated for inclusion; and

WHEREAS: Auburn Court was designed by Boston Architects Goody, Clancy and Associates and was built in 1996; the project includes a public park and a mix of 137 market-rate and affordable rental units on 3.2 acres; and

WHEREAS: The exhibit's selectors particularly praised the design's "sidedness" (unique look of each of the four sides) and use of porches, balconies, courtyards and other semi-public spaces; now therefore be it
