In the year One Thousand Eight-Hundred and Sixty-one.

An Ordinance

in addition to the "Ordinance in relation to Streets".

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Cambridge, as follows:-

Sec. 1. No person shall move, or assist in moving, any house, shop, or other building, through or upon any street in the City, unless a written license therefor has been first obtained, specifying the terms and conditions on which such removal may be made.

Sec. 2. Such licenses may be granted by the Mayor and Aldermen at any time when they are in session, or at any other time by the Mayor, with the consent and approbation of an Alderman residing in the ward where such building is situated.

Sec. 3. Any person who shall offend against any of the provisions contained in the first section of this Ordinance, shall forfeit and pay, for each offence, a sum not exceeding twenty dollars.

Sec. 4. The sixteenth section of the Ordinance to
which this is in addition is hereby repealed.
