VICE MAYOR REEVES

WHEREAS: The City Council supports the greatest possible participation of minority businesses in contracts for supplies, equipment, services, and construction, awarded by firms doing business with the Commonwealth of Massachusetts; and

WHEREAS: It is the goal of the Massachusetts Housing Finance Agency to not only expend 5 % of its own operating budget on each MHFA financed development with minority businesses, but also to encourage MHFA financed developments to develop and implement an aggressive marketing program to involve Minority Business Enterprises to the maximum extend possible; and

WHEREAS: To this end, the Massachusetts Housing Finance Agency is holding a Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) Vendors' Fair, on Tuesday, April 23, 1991, from 7 p.m. to 9 p.m. at the St. Paul AME Christian Life Center, at 85 Bishop Richard Allen Drive, in Cambridge; and

WHEREAS: This vendors' Fair is designed to provide minority business with an opportunity to present their products, goods, and services to representatives of MHFA financed developments, and the results of past fairs have included over four million dollars in Minority Business Enterprise awards made in the first six months of Funding Year, 1991; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the City Council welcome the Massachusetts Housing Finance Agency's Minority Business Enterprise Vendors' Fair to the City of Cambridge, and express its deep appreciation for the MHFA's commitment to excellence in the assistance of minority business; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to prepare a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution for presentation at the Minority Business Enterprise Vendors' Fair on behalf of the entire City Council.
