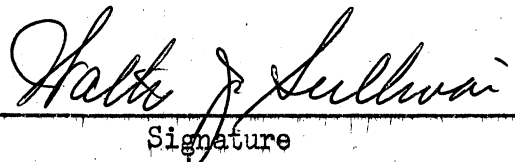

The City of Cambridge has been taking constructive steps to improve delivery of Police Services and to insure a more modern and professional management approach within the department, and

WHEREAS:

As part of this effort, the City recently increased the size of the Police Force by 35% with the appointment of 82 new patrolmen, and

WHEREAS:

The City has applied for funding to E.D.A. under the Public Works Act of 1976 so that renovation of the Police building can begin in earnest, and

WHEREAS:

The City ought to coordinate these efforts so that increased staff, better management and plant renovation are accommodated in an intergrated plan, therefore be it

RESOLVED:

That the City Council endorse the concept that the Police building be used solely by the Police Department, and be it further

RESOLVED:

That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to draw up a relocation plan in conjunction with both the present occupants of the building as well as representatives from other veteran's organizations so that the Veterans of Foreign Wars, the American Legion and the Election Commission are provided with suitable and proper sites, and be it further

RESOLVED:

That no decision on the relocation of any Veteran's Organization or of the Election Commission be made until this City Council has reviewed the final plans and relocation sites.
