- WHEREAS: During the Patriot's Day weekend, several major intersections throughout the City failed to have properly working traffic lights; and
- WHEREAS: During this weekend period accidents occurred at some of these intersections, resulting in both property and personal injury; and
- WHEREAS: Only a few weeks ago, the same thing occurred at some of the same intersections, causing great concern regarding the public safety of both pedestrians and that which governs vehicular traffic; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to instruct the Director of Traffic and Parking to prepare a report as to why the traffic lights throughout the City are not maintained; said report to include whether or not the maintenance of the lights is the responsibility of the City or a private contractor, if it is a private contractor, what are the reasons for these lights to remain flashing for a period of seventy-two hours, as well as an indication as to why an engineer of the Traffic Department cannot be assigned to monitor these lights during weekend periods; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to submit a report to the Council relative to this order, as soon as possible.
