ORDERED:

February 1, 1982

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Quincy
as follows:

The City of Quincy, under the provisions of Article LXXXIX
of the Amendments to the Constitution of the Commonwealth,
hereby petitions the General Court to enact the following
legislation in substantially the same form:

"AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE USE OF ANIMALS IMPOUNDED IN THE CITY
OF QUINCY FOR SCIENTIFIC OR EXPERIMENTAL PURPOSES."

SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary,
any animal as defined in section one of chapter forty-nine A of
the General Laws, impounded in any animal pound, as defined in
said section one of chapter forty-nine A which is located in
said city, is hereby exempt from the provisions of section
three of said chapter forty-nine A, and no such animal pound
located in said city shall be permitted to deliver from its
available impounded animals, any animal to a licensee as defined
in said section one of said chapter forty-nine A for the
purpose of scientific investigation, experimentation, instruc-
tion, or testing of drugs or medicine.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
