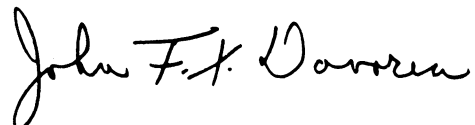

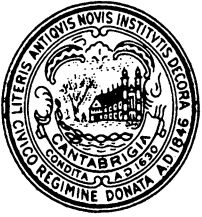

2. The purposes for which the corporation is formed are as follows: To establish and maintain facilities for the prevention and treatment of alcoholism and other associated and related problems, principally for persons in or near the greater Boston area; to maintain special facilities for the care, treatment, and detoxification of intoxicated persons or alcoholics, either on an inpatient or outpatient basis, including post-institutional after-care and rehabilitation; to render emergency medical services, intermediate care services, post-hospitalization services; to develop specialized training programs or materials relating to the prevention or treatment of alcoholism; to develop inservice training or short-term refresher courses with respect to such services; to train personnel to operate, supervise, and administer such services; to conduct surveys and field trips to evaluate the adequacy of the programs for the prevention and treatment of alcoholism; to cooperate with the law enforcement agencies in dealing with problems of alcoholism; to solicit and accept for and in relation to the above purposes any gift, bequest of money or property and any grant or loans of money, services or property from the federal government, the Commonwealth or any political subdivision thereof, or from any other source; and to contract with any of the foregoing for any of the above purposes; no part of the net earnings of the corporation will inure to the benefit of any private member or individual, substantial part of its activities is the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and it will not participate in or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office; to exercise all the powers granted to a corporation under G. L. 180 in furtherance of the above-mentioned purposes.

NOTE: If provisions for which the space provided under Articles 2, 3 and 4 is not sufficient, additions should be set out on continuation sheets to be numbered 2A, 2B, etc. Indicate under each Article where the provision is set out. Continuation sheets shall be on 8½" x 11" paper and must have a left-hand margin 1 inch wide for binding. Only one side should be used.
