- WHEREAS: The Cambridge YWCA is a key provider of single room-occupancy housing for low-income women in Cambridge; and
- WHEREAS: The YWCA would like to push forward plans to renovate and expand its very critical affordable housing; and
- WHEREAS: The Cambridge Housing Authority and the Cambridge YWCA have the opportunity to apply for funds under the Federal McKinney Act to develop housing opportunities for the increasing homeless population of Cambridge; and
- WHEREAS: The Cambridge City Council has long recognized the enormous need for poor people in our community to have more housing opportunities, a need that is increasingly difficult to fill in an era of reduced federal and state funds; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council strongly supports the application of the Cambridge Housing Authority for Section 8 funding for the Cambridge YWCA under the Moderate Rehabilitation Program for Single Room Occupancy (SRO) Dwellings for Homeless Individuals under the federal McKinney Act, as administered by the Department of Housing and Urban Development; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward suitably engrossed copies of this resolution to the Department of Housing and Urban Development, the Cambridge Housing Authority and the Cambridge YWCA.
