That, in accordance with the provisions of an ordinance relative to placing and maintaining signs, the Commissioner of Public Works be and hereby is authorized to grant a permit to The Cambridge Trust Company, 68 Harrison Avenue, Boston for the installation of a clock at the premises numbered 353 Huron Avenue, Cambridge, Massachusetts.

Provided that, before erecting the above named clock, the petitioner shall obtain a permit from the Inspectional Services Department and file with the City Clerk a satisfactory bond in the sum of Twenty Thousand (\$20,000.00) dollars, conditioned to save harmless the City of Cambridge from all claims for damages arising from the installation, maintenance and use of said clock.

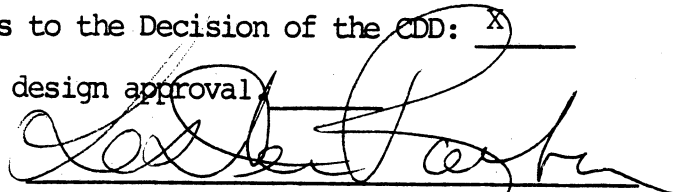

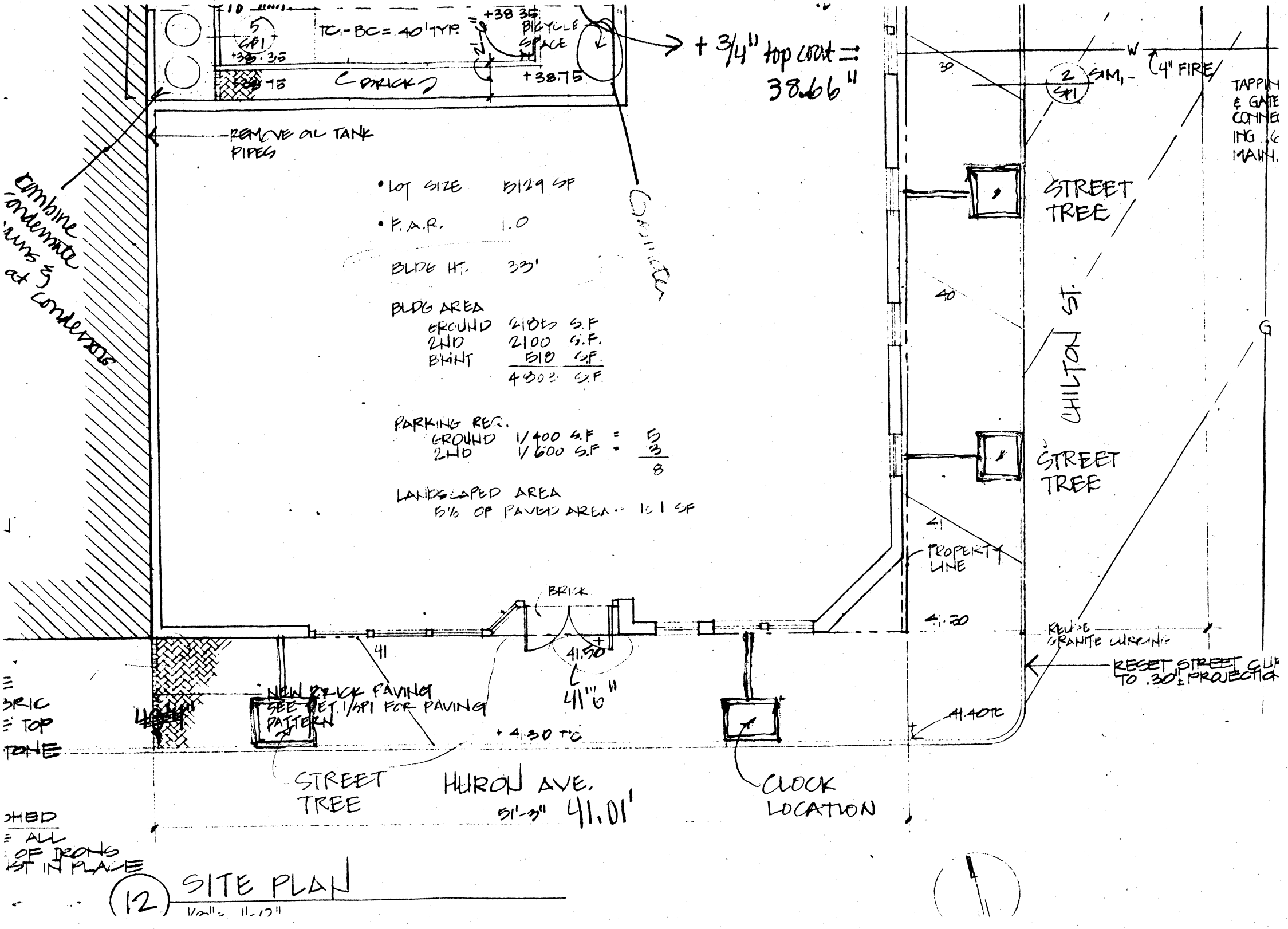

Although shown with Colonial (Type MS) hands with rod tails, Arrow (Type AS) hands or Colonial hands with Arrow tails are also available. Sizes from 15" to 60" (larger on special order) for indoor or outdoor use. Standard finishes are brushed brass, brushed aluminum or durable paint.

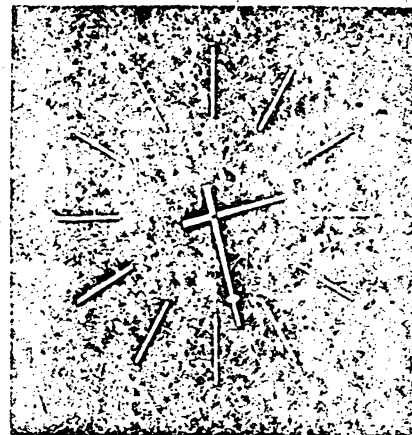
