- WHEREAS: The City of Cambridge and the Greater Boston area suffer a shortage of affordable housing, affecting individuals and families and threatening the long-term economic viability of the region; and
- WHEREAS: In response to this need the Commonwealth of Massachusetts instituted a Housing Trust Fund as part of the budget for the 2001 Fiscal Year; and
- WHEREAS: The State Housing Trust Fund was to be funded with \$20 million in State funds for the 2001, 2002, 2003, 2004, and 2005 Fiscal Years; and
- WHEREAS: The budget reported out by the House Ways and Means Committee did not fund the Trust Fund in Fiscal Year 2002, threatening future funding of this needed effort; and
- WHEREAS: The City of Cambridge has aggressively worked to secure adequate resources to fund housing programs and encourages the Commonwealth to join in this effort; now therefor be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council encourage our State legislative delegation to make every effort to ensure that promised funding for the State Housing Trust Fund is included in the FY 2002 budget; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to the members of the State legislative delegation on behalf of the entire City Council.
