Dear Mr. Vellucci:

I am writing to suggest a solution to the current inconvenience which Cambridge residents must endure in order to obtain a resident parking sticker. I propose that residents be given the choice of paying the current fee and picking up their sticker in person or pay an additional fee of \$3.00 in order to obtain a sticker by mail. A person who wants a sticker to be mailed would have to send the City the card which is sent out each year along with a check. The sticker would not be sent until the check clears the bank. The additional fee would cover the extra cost of postage and labor involved in mailing the stickers.

I request that this proposal be submitted to the City Council. Under this system the eliminate aggravation without increasing its costs or forcing people who would prefer to come in person to pay more for a sticker. Since many people would ask to have the sticker mailed to them those who do come in person would not have to face long lines.
