Was silent-screen actress

LOS ANGELES — Joan Marsh, a silent-screen actress of the 1920s and 1930s who made a successful transition to talkies before retiring from business in the 1940s, has died at age 86.

Miss Marsh died at her home near Ojai, Calif., Aug. 10, the Los Angeles Times reported. Her funeral services were held in Santa Monica, Calif.

The daughter of early silent-film actor Harry Marsh, Miss Marsh began her career as a child and appeared in more than 100 silent films that starred her father.

A platinum blonde who was often compared with movie star Clara Bow, Miss Marsh successfully made the transition to "talkies" and specialized in romantic comedies.

She starred in several films, including "Are You Listening?", "Great to be Alive," "Life Begins at College," and "Road to Zanzibar."

An early marriage to writer Charles Belden ended in divorce. In 1943, she married D.W. Morrell and retired from the business soon after, making her last film, "Follow the Leader," in 1944.
