- WHEREAS: Recently one of two men allegedly involved in a stabbing incident at Ames Department Store at the Fresh Pond Shopping Center was placed under arrest shortly after the incident by Captain Henry W. Breen, Commander of Day Operations, as he was on routine patrol; and
- WHEREAS: The suspect was charged with two counts of assault and battery with a dangerous weapon, shoplifting and driving without a license; now therefore be it
- RESOVLED: That this City Council go on record congratulating Captain Henry W. Breen and the patrol officers involved in making this arrest and to further extend the appreciation of the City Council to the men and women of the Cambridge Police Department; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Chief Anthony G. Paolillo and Captain Henry W. Breen on behalf of the entire City Council.
