WHEREAS:

Official notice has been received from the military authorities at Camp Stuart of the death of Joseph Duris, an assistant assessor of the City of Cambridge, it is fitting that the City Council express recognition of the public loss sustained by reason of his death.

Mr. Duris was born in Cambridge in 1890 and grew up in our midst, attended our schools and filled a responsible position with Ginn and Company, one of Cambridge's leading concerns. He was a familiar figure in the East Cambridge district, where he always resided, and possessed a companionable nature which won for him a high place in popular regard.

Like thousands of the splendid youth of the country, Joseph Duris gave up his life that the nation might live and spread the doctrine of the right of man to life, ~~and~~ liberty and pursuit of happiness to all the peoples of the world. All that man can give he gave and the thought of it will enoble his memory forever.

It is therefore

That we extend to the family of Joseph Duris the assurance of our deepest sympathy together with a copy of these resolutions.
