Gentlemen:

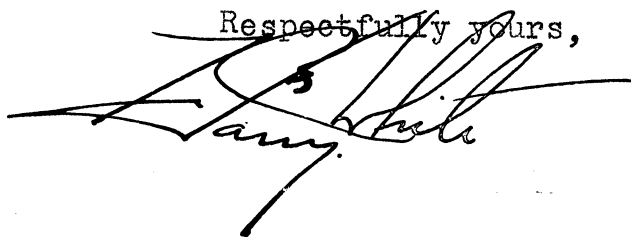

This property formerly was used as a field locker by my father, the late Frederick O. White, but since his death, due to the annoyance of the residents in that vicinity and destruction of property and equipment of ours, it was necessary to go to great expense in removing the building and regrading the land.

This property adjoins the playground and abuts a lot owned by the City which faces Putman Avenue and would give the City clear access to Montague Street from Putman Avenue.

I would appreciate it if your Honorable Body would consider this matter. I will endeavor to meet any reasonable offer by the City.

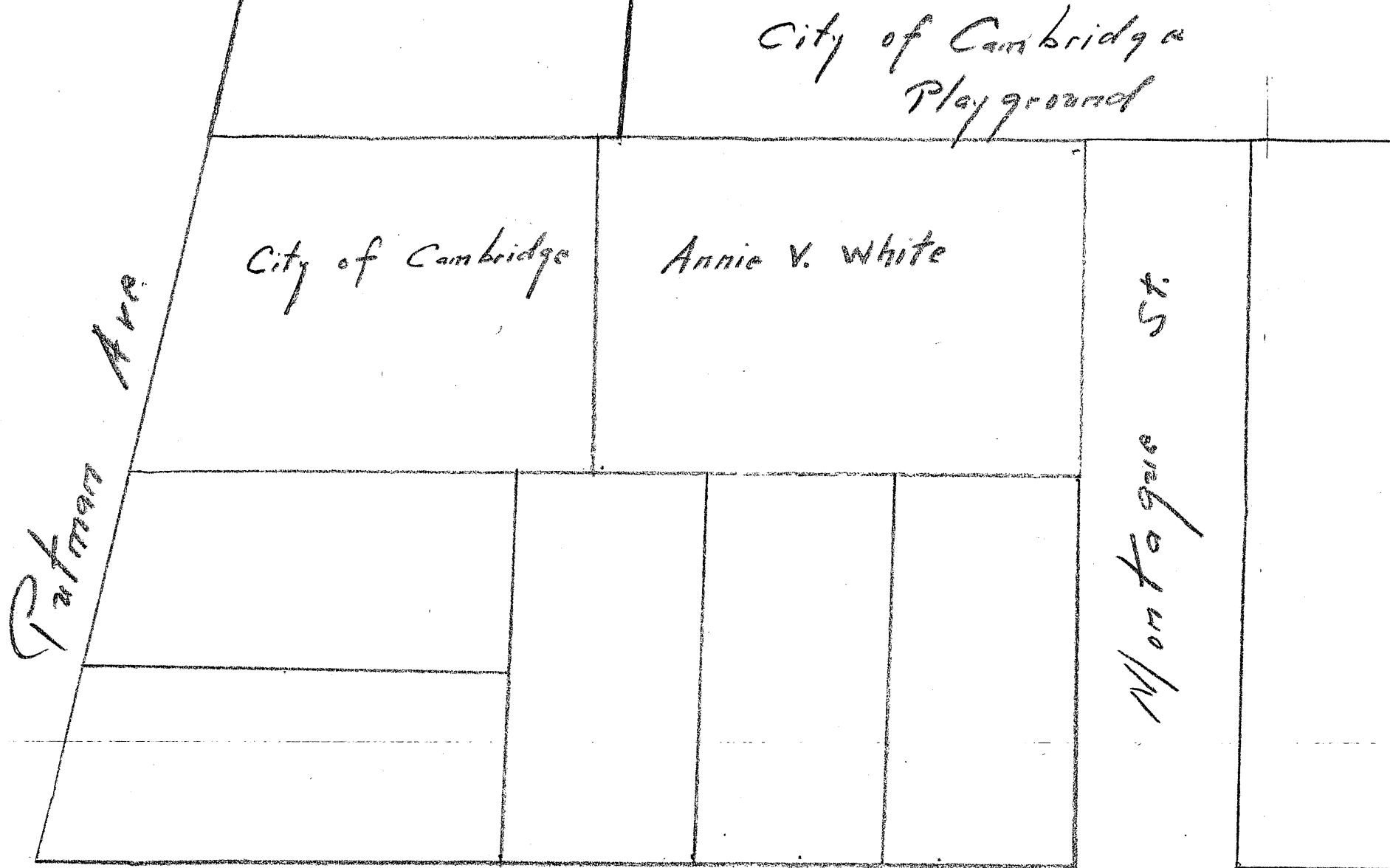

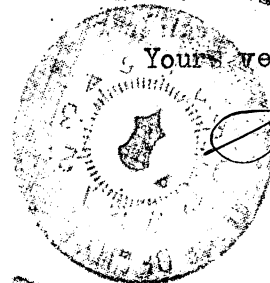
