On the 16th of November, 1976 death brought to a close the active life of Wilfred J. Metivier, former teacher and Football Coach of the Rindge Technical School, and

WHEREAS:

Wilfred J. Metivier was an outstanding athlete at Rindge Technical School prior to his enrollment at Holy Cross College where he captained the football team in 1914 and was elected to the Holy Cross Hall of Fame in 1973, and

WHEREAS:

The name Metivier was synonymous with great achievements in the field of athletics since his brother Dewey was a member of the Cleveland Indians and played major league baseball with that team for several years, and

WHEREAS:

Wilfred J. Metivier will be long remembered for the outstanding teams that he coached at Rindge Technical School, for his work as President of the State Association of Football Coaches and his founding of the Gridiron Club of Boston, be it therefore

RESOLVED:

That the Mayor and City Council of the City of Cambridge, by this resolution and public record, recognize the profound influence of Wilfred J. Metivier on the athletic scene of the City of Cambridge, recognizing further that his death is a distinct loss to the University City where he achieved such deep respect and affection, and be it further

That this resolution be spread among the minutes of the Council Record and a copy thereof be sent to his family in recognition of Mr. Metivier's honored place in this University City.
