## OBITUARIES

# William McDermott Jr., 1st of first MASH unit

William V. McDermott Jr. of Dedham, a Boston surgeon who died Thursday after battles with idiopathic pulmonary disease. He was 84.

In Salem, Dr. McDermott was president of Dedham for years.

McDermott graduated from Dedham High School and Exeter Academy before earning a degree in French literature and history from Harvard College in 1938. Dr. McDermott graduated from Harvard Medical School in 1942.

He served in the Army in surgery during World War II. Dr. McDermott served in General Patton's 3rd Army as a member of the first (Mobile Army Surgical Hospital) unit of the Army. He fought in the Battle of Normandy, the Battle of the Bulge, the conquest of Germany, and the liberation of a concentration camp in Ebensee, Austria.

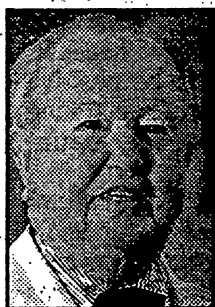
Dr. McDermott was awarded the Bronze Star, Oak Leaf Cluster, and Battle Stars. Letters that came from the war to his first wife, Anne O'Riordan, are in a book, "Tom Brokaw's book, 'The Greatest Generation.'"

After his death, he was the David W. Cheever Professor of Surgery Emeritus at Harvard Medical School. Previously, he was a surgeon at Massachusetts General Hospital for nearly 20 years. He served as chairman of Surgical Services at the Boston City Hospital and as a member of the Deaconess Medical Center for 22 years.

Dr. McDermott was a member of several teams sponsored by the Boston City Hospital and the Deaconess Medical Center.

Dr. McDermott also pioneered many advances in hepatic surgery and helped organize the first liver transplantation teams in Boston.

Dr. McDermott wrote eight books, wrote chapters in 12 books and contributed more than 230 papers to scientific journals. He received the Distinguished Alumnus Award from Harvard in 1992 and was a member of the Harvard Club for more than 50 years.

He was president of the American College of Surgeons, Massachusetts Surgical Society, the New England Surgical Society and the Boston Surgical Society and he has endowed chairs in his name at Harvard Medical School and Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center.

Dr. McDermott was a member of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, the American Surgical Association, the Tavern Club, the Roxbury Clinical Records Club and the Aesculapian Club.

Husband of the late Blanche O'Riordan, Mary Boit McDermott and Frances Weld Gardner, Dr. McDermott is survived by two daughters, Gwen of Dedham and Jane McDermott Hoch of Chestnut Hill; a son, William Shaw of Dedham; and six grandchildren.

A funeral Mass will be celebrated at 10 a.m. Thursday at St. Ignatius of Loyola Church, Chestnut Hill.
