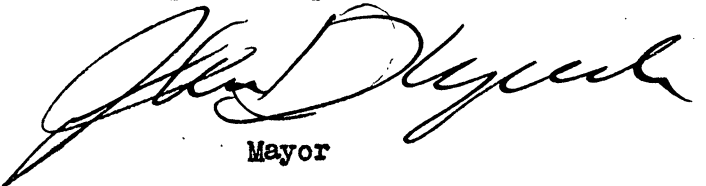
To the Honorable, the City Council:

A communication has been received from His Honor, the Mayor notifying the City Council of the death of Peter P. Bleiler it is fitting and proper that notice be taken of the sad event.

Peter P. Bleiler was an old and respected citizen of Cambridge, a resident of the eastern end of the city in the days when the German and Irish born citizens were dominant figures in that community.

A business man, highly respected by all, it was but natural that he should be selected as a representative in the city's affairs. He served Cambridge well in the Board of Aldermen just before the turn of the century and even after he laid down the reins of government he maintained an active interest in things political. While serving in the Board of Aldermen he was universally recognized as the firemen's friend and until his death never lost his interest in this particular group of city employees.

He was a kindly gentleman, had positive opinions, yet never antagonized those with whom he came in contact. His friendships were many and enduring, his sincerity and honesty were ever apparent. It is therefore

That the City Council hereby acknowledges the loss sustained by the city and countless friends in the passing away of Peter P. Bleiler and directs that a copy of these resolutions be spread upon the records and that a copy be sent to the family of the deceased.
