The Committee on *Roads and Bridges,*
to which was referred the petition of Thomas D. Mason,
by his attorney Robert T. Bateson, praying that an
additional award may be made to him for damages
to his land and building, taken & widened and extended
Front Street, — Reports,

Recommending that

the petitioner have leave to withdraw. Your Committee
is of the opinion that the award already made in this
case is ample compensation for all property taken and
damage to the estate: the Committee was induced to
make the award larger than it otherwise would have
done, because of the fact that the building, which
the Committee deemed absolutely worthless had been
valued by the assessors at \$1800.— and that sum was
therefore allowed for it, though it was of no value
whatever.
