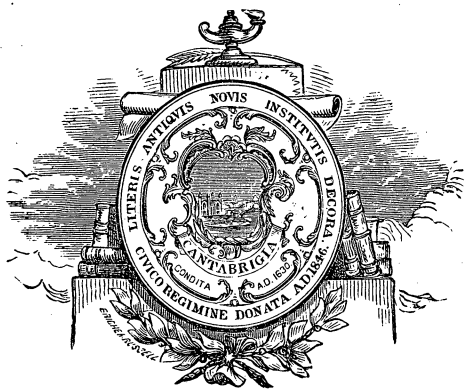




CITY OF CAMBRIDGE.

IN BOARD OF ALDERMEN,

Apr. 15. 1885.

WHEREAS: It is adjudged by this Board that the public necessity and convenience require that

Rockingham Street, so-called, extending from Henry Street, to Marginal Avenue, so-called, between Pearl and Brookline Streets

should be laid out as a public Street. Ordered that a strip of land

in width between Henry Street and Marginal Avenue, as aforesaid, Forty feet

included between the

red

lines as shown on a plan drawn by

W. A. Mason
Surveyor, dated Sept. 1884,

and now before this Board, be taken for public use and laid out as a public Street.

Ordered that

no

damages be allowed for the land so taken as aforesaid,

the several owners and abutters having waived the usual notice of such laying out, and agreed to claim no damages on account thereof.
