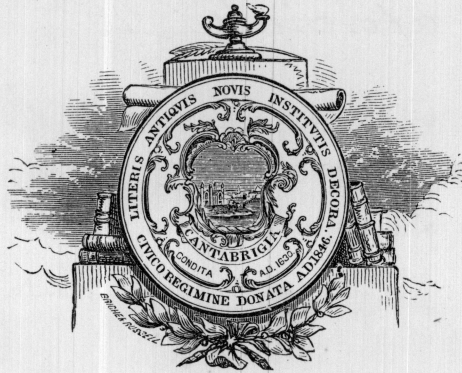

Decr 4. 1872

Resolved, That the public convenience and necessity require that

Dunster Street
be widened

by taking for this purpose ^a certain parcels of land, as shown on a plan prepared by the City Engineer, and now before this Board. *on file in the Office of the City Engineer,*

Therefore, Ordered, that so much of the land on *the westerly side of said* Dunster Street, between land of William Wright and *Wintthrop Street*

as is included between the *red* lines shown on a plan of *Dunster Street*

W. M. A. Mason
Street, drawn by *the City Engineer*, dated *May 10, 1851* and now *on file* before this *in the*

Office of the City Engineer
Board, be taken for public use, and laid out as a public way and a part of said *Dunster*
Street.

Ordered, ~~That damages occasioned by said widening be estimated and awarded as follows:-~~

That no damages be awarded for the land
so taken as aforesaid.
