

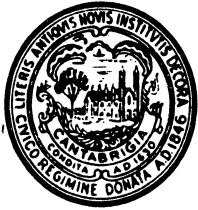
Sec. 14.5 PARKING FOR CERTAIN PURPOSES PROHIBITED

No person shall park a vehicle upon any roadway for the principal purpose of:

- (a) Displaying such vehicle for sale, or for the sole purpose of displaying advertising signs.
- (b) Washing, greasing or repairing such vehicle except repairs necessitated by an emergency.
- (c) Storage. Parking or leaving a motor vehicle, or other vehicle or conveyance upon any public way without moving it from the place where it was parked for a period of more than 24 hours, shall be deemed to be storage and a violation of this section, except for a motor vehicle displaying a valid Resident Parking Permit and that vehicle is parked on a public way which is listed in Schedule 6C or 7B (Permit Parking areas) which are attached to and made a part of these regulations. - (d) Trailer Parking. No person or driver shall park, cause or allow, any type of Trailer or Trailer body on any Public Way. (34)

Sec. 14.6 STANDING AND PARKING ADJACENT TO SCHOOLS AND PUBLIC BUILDING ENTRANCES

- (a) The Traffic Director is hereby authorized to erect signs indicating no standing or parking upon either or both sides of any street or parts thereof, adjacent to any school property when such parking would, in his opinion, interfere with traffic or create a hazardous situation.
- (b) The Traffic Director is hereby authorized to erect signs indicating no standing or parking at any curb adjacent to or near the entrances of a church, theatre, hotel, hospital, railway station, public building or any place of public assemblage.
- (c) When official signs are erected indicating no standing or parking at places as authorized herein, no person shall stand or park a vehicle in any such designated place.

To The Honorable, The City Council:

In response to Awaiting Report Item No. 35, regarding whether ticketing for "storage" runs contrary to the goals of the Trip Reduction Policy, Director of Traffic, Parking & Transportation Susan Clippinger and Director of Environmental Programs Elizabeth Epstein report the following:

The ticketing of vehicles for "storage" is consistent with the Vehicle Trip Reduction Ordinance. Storage applies only to non-resident vehicles parked more than 24-hours without being moved. Vehicles with resident permit stickers parked on a public way with signs posted for permit parking are not effectived by the "storage" policy.

A copy of the Traffic, Parking & Transportation Department's regulation Section 14.5(c) is attached.
