



# CITY OF CAMBRIDGE.

IN BOARD OF ALDERMEN,

*May 10 1882*

WHEREAS: It is adjudged by this Board that the public necessity and convenience require that *Bond street, so called, between Concord Avenue and Garden street.*

should be laid out as a public Street. Ordered that a strip of land *fifty feet* in width between *Concord Avenue and Garden street,*

included between the *red* lines as shown on a plan drawn by *Arthur Hodges* Civil Engineer, dated *January 28<sup>d</sup>. 1882,*

and now before this Board, be taken for public use and laid out as a public Street.

Ordered that *no* damages be allowed for the land so taken as aforesaid, *the several owners of real estate abutting on said street having agreed in writing to make no claim for such damages.*

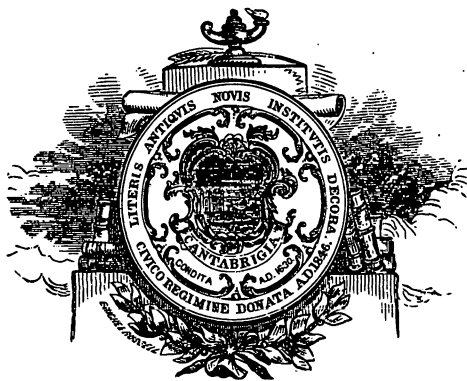

be *fifty* feet wide, free from all encroachments, and graded to the

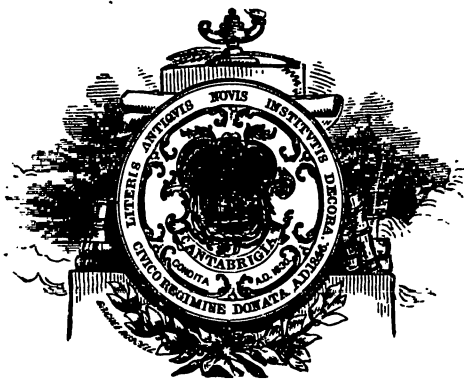
satisfaction of the Committee on Roads and Bridges, on the part of this Board, and also agreed to claim no damages for land taken for said street.

Your committee further recommend the adoption of the accompanying order for laying out said Bond street.

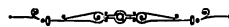
