

City of Cambridge.

In Board of Aldermen, July 31, 1872.

Resolved, That the public necessity and convenience require that Forest-Street, so called, should be laid out as a public street or way:

Therefore Ordered, That Forest-Street, from North Avenue to the Sawmills line, be laid out as a public street or way, said street to be forty feet in width and to lie on the southerly side of the westerly line of Forest-Street, as the same is delineated on a Plan of said street, drawn by W. S. Barbour, dated May, 1868, and now on file in the office of the City Engineer.

Ordered, That no damages be allowed to the persons whose land is taken, in laying out said street as aforesaid.
