NOTICE TO CONTRACTORS.

Proposals for Furnishing Granite Paving Blocks.

SEALD PROPOSALS will be received at this office until THURSDAY, December 13, at 12 o'clock, noon, for supplying the city with 300,000 No. 1 Granite Paving Blocks; the stone to be equal in quality to the best Cape Ann or Quincy granite, and the blocks to be of the following dimensions and specifications: Width, $3\frac{1}{2}$ to 4 inches; length, 7 to 8 inches; depth, $7\frac{1}{2}$ to 8 inches. All the edges to be sharp and straight, forming right angles at their intersections, both horizontally and vertically. The faces to be straight split and free from bunches or depressions. Each and every block to be equal both as regards quality and finish and to be in every respect satisfactory to the Committee on Roads and Bridges and the Superintendent of Streets.

Bids will be received for supplying the stone in lots of 50,000, or more, blocks, as may be offered.

Proposals to state the price per thousand blocks delivered at such wharves, in this city, as may be designated, by the Committee on Roads and Bridges, at such times as may be required by the Superintendent of Streets, during the months of May, June and July, 1889. A sample of the blocks must accompany each proposal.

Each proposal must be accompanied by a deposit of the sum of \$500 in cash, at the office of the City Treasurer, or in place thereof the bidder may deposit a properly certified check for a like sum, the same to be as a guaranty that he will accept the award of the contract if made in accordance with the bid, and sign the same within five days from the date of notice of such award, such cash or check to be returned to the bidder depositing the same in case his proposal is not accepted by the committee.

The right is reserved to reject any or all proposals.

The successful bidder will be required to furnish a bond with securities satisfactory to the Committee on Roads and Bridges, for the faithful performance of the contract.
