- WHEREAS: This City Council was deeply saddened upon learning of the death of Carmelo Consolo, a/k/a Tony DiGregorio, a/k/a Tommy Greb; and
- WHEREAS: Tommy, a native of the West End of Boston, began his boxing career at the age of 13 at the West End House and for the Newsboy's Club, a career which spanned over many years and 250 fights; and
- WHEREAS: In 1939 Tommy Greb won the National Championship Amateur Title Golden Glove Award and also was the recipient of the Diamond Belt and Diamond Ring of New England; and
- WHEREAS: In 1941 Tommy turned a professional and eventually won the New England Lightweight Championship; and
- WHEREAS: Tommy completed his boxing career in 1953 but continued to remain interested and affiliated with the sport, and for several years resided in the City of Cambridge; and
- WHEREAS: Tommy will be missed by all his friends, colleagues and sports figures with whom he had such a close and professional relationship throughout his career; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to the members of Tommy's family; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward suitably engrossed copies of this resolution to the family of Tommy Greb on behalf of the entire City Council.
