The Committee on Cable Television and Communications conducted a public hearing on Thursday, October 24, 1991, in the Sullivan Chamber City Hall beginning at 6:18 P.M.. The purpose of the hearing was to receive public testimony relative to communications received from Mr. George Welch regarding several cable television issues. Members present were: Councillor William Walsh and City Clerk Joseph Connarton.

Councillor Walsh opened the hearing and recognized ~~Mr. George Welch~~, 3 Woodrow Wilson Court, Cambridge who reiterated much of what was discussed by others at this hearing relative to the failure of Continental Cablevision to provide certain services to the people of Cambridge which are called for in the municipal franchise. Furthermore, he stated that since the report that he had demanded from the Committee had in fact been submitted to the City Council he was now satisfied on that issue. He also informed the Committee that the Welch v. Connarton matter was currently scheduled for a hearing in court on November 4, 1991 and that he anticipates that will be resolved. Finally he made reference to his communication entitled communication #1, dated September 12, 1991 relative to the City Manager being the issuing authority for a Cable Television license and a complaint against both the City Manager and Mr. Ned Casey of the Cable Office for the City of Cambridge. He requested that all members of the City Council declare their support for this complaint and to join with him in its filing.

The hearing was adjourned at 6:35 P.M.
