- WHEREAS: Timothy J. Keefe was born in Cambridge on January 1, 1856 on the corner of Trowbridge and Cambridge Streets; and
- WHEREAS: Timothy J. Keefe lived on the corner of Trowbridge and Cambridge Streets until April 23, 1933 when he passed away; and
- WHEREAS: During his lifetime, Timothy J. Keefe became one of Cambridge's greatest baseball athletes winning 346 games in fourteen years as a professional baseball pitcher during which in 1883 he won 41 games, in 1884 he won 37 games and in 1885 he won 42 games during which time Timothy J. Keefe pioneered the "Change of Pace" pitch; and
- WHEREAS: Timothy J. Keefe has brought national recognition to Cambridge by being elected to Baseball's Hall of Fame in 1964; therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record as officially congratulating the family of Timothy J. Keefe for his remarkable contributions to the history of this City and further that the intersection of Trowbridge Street and Cambridge Street be and hereinafter is named Timothy J. Keefe Square with a suitable sign erected thereto; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to the family of Timothy J. Keefe.
