- WHEREAS: The U.S. medal count (6 gold, 4 silver, 2 bronze) equal the best in Winter Olympic history (1932); and
- WHEREAS: Four young men from this area were particularly instrumental in producing at Lake Placid what has been generally acknowledged as the most outstanding feat in all Winter Olympic history in the winning of a gold medal in hockey; and
- WHEREAS: This was the first gold medal won by the United States in hockey since 1960 when two Cambridge young men, Billy and Bobby Cleary, were most prominent in that accomplishment; therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record as offering its heartiest congratulations to the United States Hockey Team Captain Mike Eruzione of Winthrop, Jack O'Callahan of Charlestown, Jim Craig of North Easton and Dave Silk of Scituate for exhibiting an inspiring example of American heart and grit, and unquenchable spirit and for giving all of us, even those who do not know a hockey blue line from an M.B.T.A. red line, an incredible thrill and sense of pride in our country's young men that we will not soon forget; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward suitably engrossed copies of this resolution to these outstanding young men on behalf of the entire City Council.
