Question 6. Affordable Housing

Shall the state representative from this district be instructed to vote in favor of legislation stimulating increased production and availability of affordable housing for middle class and low income residents of Massachusetts, including rental and home ownership?

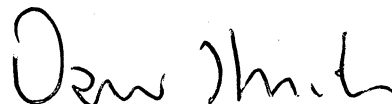
Question 7. Universal Health Care and Health Care Bill of Rights

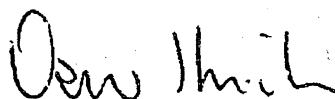
