

- WHEREAS: Anthony was a strong supporter of all youth athletics; he was instrumental in the growth of the fledgling Pop Warner team to the strong thriving organization of today; he led the City in providing a field house and top-notch playing fields at Russell Field and he was a key player in the decision and planning for a new West Cambridge youth and community center; and
- WHEREAS: As co-chair of the Human Services Committee along with Councillor Decker, he presided over the restructuring and revitalization of the City's youth centers and youth programming; and
- WHEREAS: Anthony was an advocate for Cambridge's affordable housing projects; he was an early advocate and strong supporter of inclusionary zoning, which has created over four hundred affordable units to date, and a particularly strong advocate for finding a solution to the troubling issue of the Commonwealth's failure to maintain its state-funded housing; the City Council is confident and pleased that he will be able to continue his good work on this issue as a State Senator; and
- WHEREAS: In all of Anthony's work as a City Councillor he maintained a strong vision of economic opportunity and fairness for all, regardless of race and class, and above all, his love of Cambridge and hopes for the children of Cambridge; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the City of Cambridge go on record expressing its thanks and appreciation to Anthony D. Galluccio for his many years of dedicated and distinguished service to the citizens of Cambridge; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to prepare a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to City Councillor and Senator Anthony D. Galluccio for presentation at the City Council meeting of December 17, 2007 on behalf of the entire City Council.

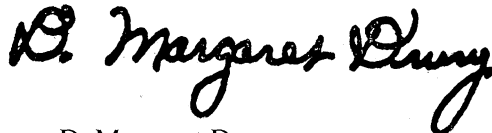

WHEREAS: Councillor Anthony D. Galluccio was elected to the Massachusetts Senate in October, 2007 and will end his service as a Cambridge City Councillor at the close of the 2006-2007 term; and

WHEREAS: Anthony grew up in Cambridge, the second child of Anthony "Tony" and Nancy Galluccio. Anthony's father, an Italian immigrant, served four years on the Cambridge School Committee and was John F. Kennedy's Campaign Secretary. Anthony's father died suddenly in 1980, when Anthony was 11, and Anthony was greatly influenced by his mother's successful struggle to raise three children as a single parent; and

WHEREAS: Upon his graduation from Cambridge Rindge and Latin High School, Anthony earned his Bachelor's Degree at Providence College then went on to earn his law degree from Suffolk University Law School; and

WHEREAS: Anthony has been a member of the Cambridge City Council for seven terms since 1994; he has served as chairman of the City Council's Economic Development, Training and Employment Committee, Cable TV, Public Utilities and Telecommunication Committee, Claims Committee, Housing Committee, University Relations Committee (co-chair) and Human Services Committee (co-chair); and

WHEREAS: Anthony served as Mayor for the 2000-2001 term; at age 32, he was the youngest Mayor elected under Cambridge's Plan E form of government; and

WHEREAS: Anthony's tenure was characterized by his commitment to the youth of the City of Cambridge and his deep and personal understanding of the importance of providing avenues for all children to succeed. Anthony was both champion and cheerleader for Cambridge Rindge and Latin School. As Mayor, he led the School Committee in the process that resulted in the revamping of the Rindge School of Technical Arts from its outdated and dwindling programs to become the excellent up-to-date technical high school that it is today. He was key to the development of the collaborative effort between Harvard and the City that created the Cambridge Summer Academy at CRLS; as well as the collaboration with the biotech industry leaders to establish programs to strengthen science learning and biotech opportunities for Cambridge students; and
