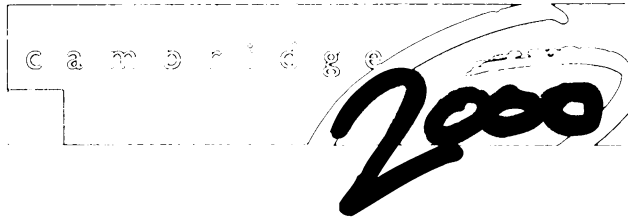
In response to Council Order Number O-32, dated June 5, 2000, Recreation Director Paul Ryder would like to submit the following for your review:

I. **Adult Basketball** – Last winter, Kevin Clark from the Recreation Division worked with Selvin Chambers and the Supporters of the Cambridge Youth Programs to implement an over thirty adult league due to declining enrollment in the 18 and over adult league (only three teams had registered which is not enough teams to develop a league). The new league had eight teams and played their games on Sunday mornings at the Frisoli Youth Center. An over thirty league will be held this summer with registration happening in late June and the league starting in July. Additionally, the Recreation Division has worked closely with adult women users of the War Memorial facility and women's adult basketball league began on June 5, 2000 and is held at Hoyt Field.

II. **Youth Basketball** – The Department's Youth Division organized a pre-teen basketball league this fall with fifty participants at the Moore Youth Center in addition to spring leagues for teens at the Frisoli and Area IV Youth Centers with 75 participants. A summer youth league for pre-teens is planned for Sennott Park and a teen league at Donnelly Field. In addition, the Department sponsors the Shoot Straight Basketball Program, with 100 participants, held during the winter at the War Memorial and is a co-sponsor of the Prime Time Basketball Camp at the Frisoli Youth Center that will be held this summer at the Frisoli Youth Center with fifty youths registered per week.

In addition to these programs, the Department has played a lead role in the development and supervision of the highly successful Hoops for Health Basketball Tournament, which was held this year on June 3, 2000.
