Joseph H. Aceto Sr. of Holbrook, a retired employee of the city of Cambridge, died after a long illness Thursday at New England Sinai Hospital in Stoughton. He was 69.

Born in Cambridge, he attended the public schools there.

Mr. Aceto worked for the Cambridge Department of Public Works and was also employed as a mail handler for the South Postal Annex.

He served on the USS Belleau Wood during World War II.

He is survived by his wife, Mabel (Freni); four daughters, Helen Cirillo, Jean Gallant, Michelle Morales and Mary; two sons, Joseph Jr. and David; three sisters, Ann Elder, Helen DeYoung and Emily Castro; and nine grandchildren.
